PREFACE

Oli's Dream is a playful collaboration between music and writing, between a piano keyboard and a typewriter keyboard, and, above all, between a composer and a poet. When composer Jaroslaw Kapuscinski and poet Camille Norton began talking about the rapport between music and poetry, they discovered that as children they had shared the same dream, the dream in which a piano becomes a typewriter and in which a typewriter becomes a piano. Oli's Dream is therefore an experiment in synaesthesia, an attempt to fuse the temporal modes of music with the spatial and temporal domains of words. In the process, the audience finds itself in the presence of a perceptive, purely aware being, Oli, who creates himself through his encounter with words. Words here make and unmake themselves from the outside in or the inside out, transforming themselves as they discover their own direction in time. As Oli's Dream unfolds in the interstices between listening to sound and reading letters on a screen, it moves into the additional spatial, visual, and temporal dimensions of live performance, enacted here by the pianist engaging in a call and response with letters, words and music.

Notes to Performer

The score is written in proportional notation. The pianist is free to take a tempo that feels most appropriate for conveying the musical (aural) and poetic (visual text-based) narration. The flow of the performance should resemble in turn speaking and singing.

To start the piece please launch the “Oli HD” Max-patch and press on “1”.

The rehearsal numbers [1-9] match the computer keyboard keys, which when depressed activate relevant audio and video pre-programmed within the Max-patch. Besides Rehearsal No.1, these keys are meant to be used for rehearsal only. In concert the program will step through the full sequence automatically.

Essential visuals and sounds are labeled in the score, and can be used as a reference. Please note that the text in the score does not represent the entirety of the projected poetry but only essential moments. Groupings of letters forming words are connected with dashes (-).


Technical Set-Up

Requirements:

- Video projector with 1080p resolution
- Stereo audio and mixer
- Yamaha Disklavier or other MIDI piano
- Small table for the laptop
- Stand light to illuminate piano keyboard without spilling light onto the screen
- Laptop running Max/MSP/Jitter
- Audio/MIDI interface & cable

To obtain correct visual projection please set the video projector’s resolution to 1920 x 1080 and on the laptop in System Preferences/Monitors/Arrangement, please position the external monitor directly above the laptop screen.
